Why It Matters

An estimated 50,000 Americans diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) turn 18 each year. In Pennsylvania, the proportion of adolescents with ASD transitioning to adulthood is growing rapidly – from 7.1% in 2005 to a projected 21.1% by 2020. LaSalle's Annual Autism Conference is an important venue for information exchange and creating a network of support and assistance for the autism community.

The Annual Autism Conference presented by LaSalle University is the area's longest-running educational event focused on advancing the lives of individuals diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder.
